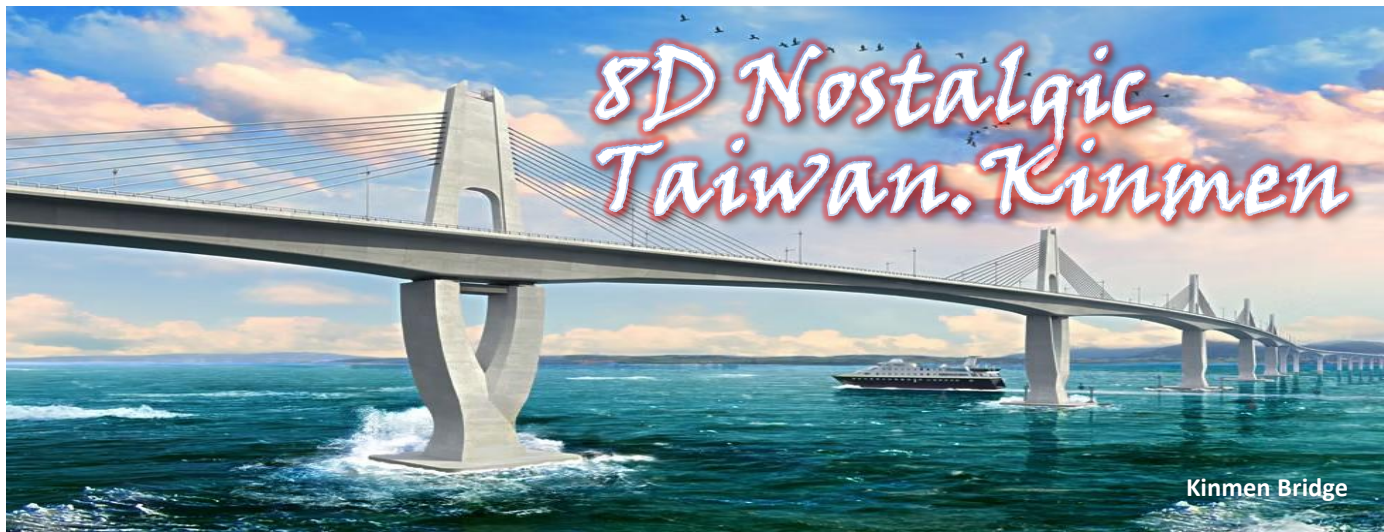




Day 1: Singapore → Taoyuan International Airport

Day 2: Taoyuan ~ Nantou

Zhongshe Flower Market: Seasonal variations of flowers and plants including: Tulips, Daisies, Lavender, Lotus flower etc.

Taichung Sixth Market: Taiwan first traditional market to operate inside a shopping mall, housed in a mall, showcasing the beauty of traditional wet markets in a modernized reinvented style.

Taichung Railway Cultural Park: Taichung Station uniquely blends three generations of railway architecture in a century-old landmark revitalized for modern use. It is now seamlessly merges heritage preservation with contemporary innovation.

Shen Ji New Village: Shen Ji New Village, also known as Rainbow Village, is a vibrant and colorful former government dormitory. It is now is now home to boutique shops, cafes, and restaurants.

Day 3: Sun Moon Lake ~ Taipei

Wenwu Temple: This 200-year-old Qing Dynasty temple near Sun Moon Lake honors both warrior gods (Emperor Wu, Guan Yu) and scholarly deities (God of Culture & Literature). Its unique architecture blends historical significance with enduring cultural charm.

Xiangshan Visitor Center: This Norihiko Dan-designed concrete structure at Sun Moon Lake features a semi-open design that perfectly frames the lake views, complemented by vibrant seasonal foliage from bald cypress trees.

National Taiwan Museum: This museum was originally established during the Japanese colonial era, making it the oldest standing museum in Taiwan.

Day 4: New Taipei City ~ Taipei

Tianlu Art Center: Understand Feng Shui to create an extraordinary life

Jingtong Station + Sky Lantern Release (4 people share 1 lantern): This 1929 Japanese-era wooden station—once vital to Taiwan's coal industry—since 2003 is listed as a historic site, facing a converted coal-washing plant café. Nearby highlights include:

The world's only "Jingtong Electronic Sky Lantern Museum", shaped like a giant lantern and the "Railway Story Museum", a railway museum for train history buffs.

Mitsui Shopping Park LaLaport Nangang : Brand new! 300shops spanning over area of 165,000 sqm, officially opened on March 20, 2025.

Raohe Night Market: Stretching 600m, one of Taipei's largest tourist night markets.

Day 5: Taipei Songshan → Kinmen ~ Kinmen's local souvenir shop

Zhaishan Tunnel: This remarkable underground complex—featuring interconnected tunnels and waterways—was painstakingly carved out for 5 years during the 823 Artillery War to house 42 waterway boat. Dubbed "*Kinmen's Underground Masterpiece*," it showcases wartime engineering and resilience.

Zhushan Village: This 650-year-old single-clan village, founded by the Xue family (originally from Xiamen), features a feng shui-optimized layout with protective highlands and a central pond designed to channel prosperity through its "*Four Waters Converging in One Pool*" formation.

Military Brothel Exhibition Hall: In 1950, Kinmen established its first 'military entertainment club' near the Zhu Zi Temple. Today, the Special Tea Room Exhibition Hall repurposes the original 'Xiaojing Special Tea Room' space to document this complex chapter of history.

Chen Jinglan Mansion: Built in 1921 by Chen Jing-lan, a local businessman who built up his success in Singapore. This Western-style mansion is Kinmen's largest. During World War II, the house was used as a military hospital.

Chenggong Coastal Tunnel + Chenggong Beach: Built into granite rock, this served as both a coastal and civil defense tunnel. While not as massive as some other tunnels in Kinmen, it's nevertheless well-equipped with a command post, howitzer base, pill box, anti-aircraft artillery base, dormitory and even a kitchen.

Day 6: Kinmen

Taiwu Mountain Scenic Area: Though only 253m high, it's the highest mountain in Kinmen. Mt Taiwu is an important place that commemorates Taiwan Strait Battle of Aug 23rd and is filled with cultural heritage eg Wu Wang Zai Ju and Haiin Temple.

Kinmen Bridge: Taiwan's first deep-water sea-crossing bridge, connecting Greater Kinmen and Lieyu Township.

Little Kinmen Tour (Shaxi Fort + Shuangkou Beach + Hujingtou War History Museum)

Shaxi Fort: this granite-gneiss fortification is nicknamed "*Phoenix Beak*" for its distinctive bird-like silhouette.

Shuangkou Beach: only about 6km from the nearest beach of Xiamen. After 1949, to prevent enemy attacks, a battle "trenches" were dug around the village, and a "railway fort" was set up for several km, a spectacular sight.

Hujingtou War History Museum : record and display the history of the battle of Little Kinmen

Jiangongyu (Kinmen's 'Moses Parting the Sea') / Kinmen's Unique Rocky Oyster Intertidal Zone (*Viewing dependent on weather and tidal conditions): Located at the Wujiang River estuary south of Kinmen City, this former military outpost between Kinmen and Liewu stands like a steadfast pillar—hence its poetic name "Jiangong Pillar of Fortitude". At low tide, walk the revealed stone path ("Moses Parting the Sea") to this historic island outpost, exploring oyster-rich tidal flats.

CDF (China Duty Free) Kinmen: Taiwan's Largest Duty-Free Shopping

Nanshihu Park: Known as "Mini Zhangjiajie" for its striking rock formations. Located on Kinmen's southeast coast, it is a Former granite quarry that supplied stone for landmarks like Taipei 101.

Scream Fountain: Just insert a coin and shout loudly into the giant speaker. If the volume exceeds 50 decibels, the fountain will start. The longer you shout, the higher the fountain will spray.

Day 7: Kinmen Airport ✈ Songshan Taipei

Yangzhai Old Street: Yangzhai Old Street in Jinsha Township was a former military hub and entertainment center. It later gained attention as a filming site for *Paradise in Service*, recreating Kinmen's 1960s history.

Shamei Morocco: Shamei Morocco is an abandoned sand-colored building on Shamei Old Street, resembling a Middle Eastern desert. Its exotic ambiance and photogenic spots make it a popular destination for young travelers!

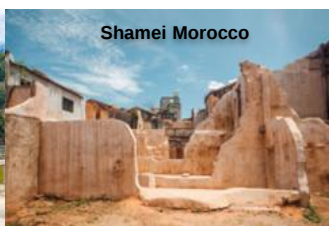
Juguang Tower: Built in 1952, this structure was originally constructed to honor the Republic of China military officers and soldiers who fought bravely in the Battle of Guningtou.

Houpu Town (Model Street): A picturesque red-brick arcade street known for its classic architecture, local shops and famous sesame biscuits. **(Qing Kinmen General's Office)** A classic Kinmen tourist attraction and a county-designated historical site. This traditional four-wing courtyard preserves the complete structure of a Qing-era yamen (government office), with wax figures reenacting its past functions in the main hall and interior offices. **(Qiu Liang-Gong's Mother's Memorial Arch)** The largest and most exquisite memorial archway in the Kinmen region.
