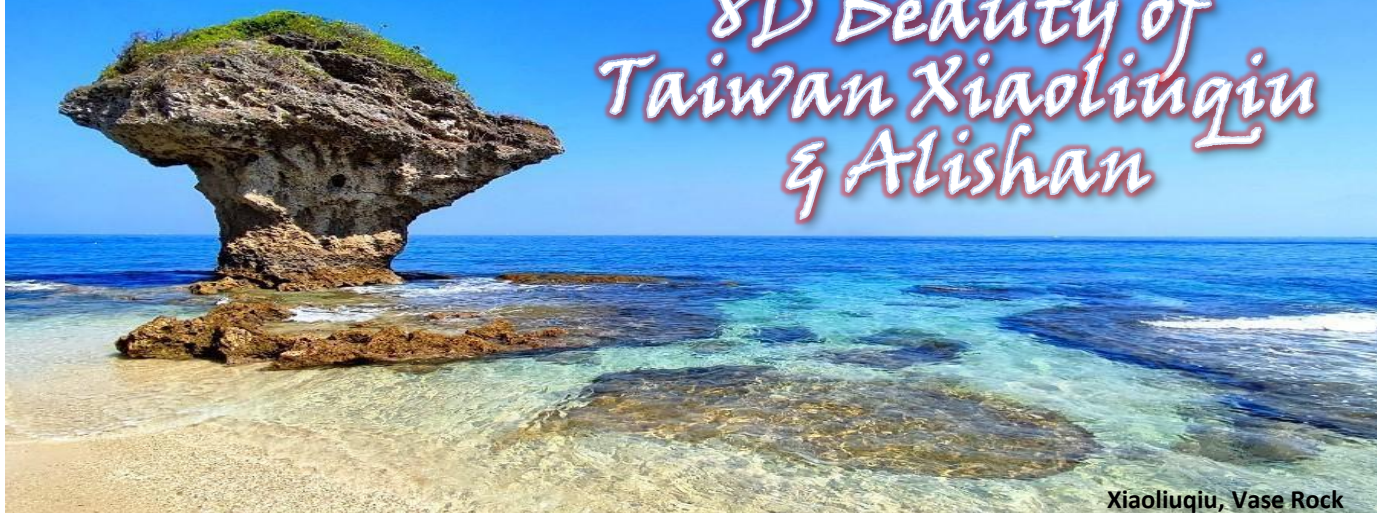


8D Beauty of Taiwan Xiaoliuqiu & Alishan

Day 1: Singapore ➔ Taoyuan International Airport ~ Taoyuan Night market

Day 2: Taoyuan ~ Taichung ~ Chiayi

Zhongshe Flower Market: A year-round garden featuring a variety of flowers to enjoy and picture-perfect spots for photo ops. Blooms include tulips, daisies, lavender, lotuses, and more.

Three Little Pigs Leisure Farm: Three Little Pigs Leisure Farm is a fairy-tale-themed recreational farm in Chiayi, offering animal encounters, storybook-inspired scenery, play areas, and nature-based learning—perfect for families, couples, and friends seeking a fun day out.

Hinoki Village: The first forest cultural and creative park in the country, and the largest Japanese-style building complex in Taiwan, witnessing the rise and fall of Alishan forestry over the past century. It stands as a testament to the history of Alishan forestry, transitioning from a logging hub to a cultural preservation site. Hinoki Forest Village is now a small Kyoto in Chiayi, Taiwan. Step into the park to feel the strong Japanese atmosphere and relax your body and mind.

Wenhua Road Night Market: Steeped in history since the Qing Dynasty, it blossomed under Japanese rule and remains Chiayi's beloved kitchen—a locals' secret where travelers can savor authentic flavors off the tourist radar.

Day 3: Alishan  Zhuoping Station (Healing Forest Bath-Shenmu Station)  Alishan Station ~ **Kaohsiung**

Alishan National Forest Bath: Rising 2,000+ meters in Chiayi, Alishan is Taiwan's iconic mountain forest—a breathing paradise of giant Hinoki wood. Here, misty railways, millennia-old trees, and sunrise spectacles weave an enchanted escape.

Alishan Forest Railway Experience: In 1899, Japanese build the Alishan Railway for transporting timber. Today, it has transformed into a sightseeing railway train for forest tourism, ranking among the globe's most extraordinary mountain railways. The century-old forest train shuttles through the hinoki wood and the misty green mountains, you will find yourself in a fairy tale world.

Day 4: Kaohsiung ~ Donggang Ferryboat Wharf  ~ (25 mins) **Xiaoliuqiu ~ Kaohsiung**

Xiaoliuqiu Island: Taiwan's only coral reef island and also one of the sea areas with the highest density of sea turtles in the world. This little island is filled with instaworthy picturesque spots. **Beauty Cave** is the most mysterious coral reef cave group on Island, formed by wave erosion. Legend has it that a beautiful woman once took refuge here. **Wild Boar Cave** is a natural sea cave. It was named after wild boars that often appeared there in the early days. The natural cave formed by the erosion of coral reefs by waves has a hidden entrance and a mysterious and tortuous cave. **Black Devil Cave** is the most famous area of limestone caves on the island. The coral reefs along the coast are like a winding maze. Tourists walking in it will have the illusion of reaching the end of the road, but there is a village in the dark.

SKM Park Outlets Kaohsiung Caoya: an amusement park and outlet in owned by Shin Kong Mitsukoshi. It is positioned as an "international lifestyle complex" with restaurants, lifestyle theme stores, and entertainment and lifestyle facilities in a semi-open-air shopping area.

Day 5: Kaohsiung ~ Taichung

Fo Guang Shan Buddha Museum: A spiritual landmark where tradition meets grandeur: walk the 240-meter sacred path beneath 48 stupas, witness the 108-meter bronze Buddha colossus "the Great Buddha of Light", and explore the Eight Pagodas embodying Buddhist wisdom.

Meinong Folk Village: Step into 300 years of unbroken heritage—where tobacco barns dot the landscape, artisans craft vibrant paper umbrellas, and the air carries the scent of Hakka glutinous rice treats. A living tapestry of language, tradition, and indigo-clad resilience.

Moon World Park: renowned for its unique badlands' topography. The striking landscape, formed by rain-eroded mudstone, features rugged hills and valleys resembling the lunar surface - hence its name "Moon World".

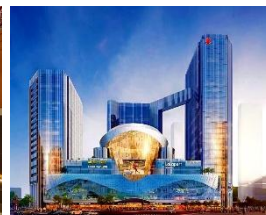

Tienlu Arts Centre: Understand Fengshui to create an extraordinary life

Wulai Old Street: As a traditional home of the Atayal tribe, Wulai Old Street offers authentic indigenous cuisine and handicrafts. It's the perfect spot near Taipei for waterfalls and cultural experiences. Must-try foods: Grilled wild boar, bamboo rice, millet wine, and maqaw (mountain pepper) sausage.

Wulai Scenic Train: Step aboard this charming historic train—once a vital timber transport, now a delightful scenic journey through lush landscapes and cultural heritage!

Wulai WaterFall: the largest in northern Taiwan. It was listed as one of the eight scenic spots in Taiwan during the Japanese colonial period, also known as the "Waterfall of Clouds". When there is abundant rainfall, it will form two waterfalls, rushing down from the valley, showing its magnificent beauty.

Nangang Lalaport: This dazzling new shopping destination (opened March 2025) spans an impressive 165,000 sqm, bringing authentic Japanese retail, dining and entertainment to Taipei. Enjoy family-friendly attractions including interactive kid zones, explore exclusive Japanese brands, and serene rooftop gardens—all under one roof!
